### **MATTHEW 23.1-12**

Matthew, the organiser, gathers into one great indictment the various charges Jesus had against the scribes and pharisees. Basically the prime accusation against them, which comes up repeatedly in the gospels, was hypocrisy. Once there is a strong code of conduct to which people pay such respect that they obey even though they do not understand (not necessarily a bad thing in itself) this danger exists, and the greater the respect for authority, the greater the danger. The Pharisees were in fact aware of the danger, and there are numerous contemporary stories, with typical Jewish humour, which ruefully recognise this; but Matthew's gospel, written in the aftermath of the break between Pharisaic Judaism and Christianity, leaves no room for niceties here.

It is striking how blandly the Church has down the ages disregarded the prohibitions of calling any man "Father", "Master", and so on. But the point of the prohibition was that no man should be an authority. In Judaism the standard means of settling disputes was to quote the decisions of Rabbis as authorities. In Christianity Christ is to be the only authority, and it is remarkable that nowhere in the New Testament is the decision or view of any man, even the pillars of the Church, cited as authority. It is only Christ and his Spirit.
