A READING FROM THE TREATISE OF ST. AMBROSE ON THE MYSTERIES.

We observe that grace has greater power than nature, and yet so far we have only spoken of the grace of a prophet's blessing. But if the blessing of man had such power as to change nature, what are we to say of the consecration wrought by God himself, where it is the very words of our Lord and Saviour which operate? This sacrament which you receive is brought about by the word of Christ. If the word of Elijah had such power as to bring down fire from heaven, shall not the word at Christ have power to change the nature of the elements? You read concerning the works of the whole universe:

'He spoke and they were made, he commanded and they were created.' Shall not the word of Christ, which was able to make out of nothing that which was not, be able to change things which already are into what they were not? For it is not less difficult to give a new nature to things than to change that nature. But why make use of arguments? Let us use the examples he gives, and by the mysteries of the incarnation prove the truth of this mystery. Did the course of nature proceed as usual before the Lord Jesus was born of Mary? If we look for the customary order of nature, a woman normally conceives after intercourse with a man. It is evident, then, that the Virgin conceived in a way contrary to nature, And this body which we bring about Is-that which was born of the Virgin, Why do you seek here the order of nature in the body of Christ, seeing that the Lord Jesus himself was born of a Virgin, outside the ordinary course of nature? It was certainly the true body of Christ which was crucified and buried, and so this is truly the sacrament of his body.

The Lord Jesus himself proclaims: This is my body. Before the blessing by the heavenly words it, is designated b a different name, after the consecration it is the body which is signified, He speaks of his blood. Before the consecration it has another name; after the consecration it is called blood, And you say Amen, that is, it is true, Let the heart within confess what the mouth utters, let the heart feel what the voice speaks.
