

CATHOLIC MISSION, FIANGO, P.O. BOX 114 KUMBA, MEME S.W.P. CAMEROON, WEST AFRICA. The following is part 1 of a 1 interesting letter sent in to Fr. J. A. Boyle (Brother of It Sweeney, Straleel) Describing missionary life in Africa.

Greetings from Cameroon, West Africa, to all readers of 'AN LIAG'. Its 7.15 s.m., Sunday morning, July 31st. I have just returned to my room after celebrating the 6 a. Mass at the Parish Church here in Fiango. There were about 350 people at this Mass. After Communion everyone started screaming and running in all direction out of the Church. The priest, not to be caught on a sinking ship either also found the nearest exit. After a while every one reassembl and Mass ended in the normal way. There is conflicting information as to what happened. Some say it was a snake that decided to find its way into the Sunday celebration. Others say somebody fainted. Anyway every one 'went forth in peacs! and we all lived to fight another day. This is Africa and I can never see the day when the congregation o Carrick, Glen, Kilcar or Meeneneary will have to flee from Church because of snakes.

Well many a time I was asked in Carrick when I was going? am here, and gradually settling down in the Parish of Flam Fiango is a Township with a population of about 80,000 peop There are 23 out stations from the central parish here. It total catholic population is about 17,000. There are two Cameroonian priests in the parish with me. The P.P. is Monsignor Lucas Atang whom I knew from University days in Dublin. The other priest's name is Fr. Edward Ngalmo. He is three years ordained and was taught right through the Major Seminary by fr. Maurice McGill from Maghera.

As you can see from the number of catholics in this parish alone the missionaries of today cannot assume that all the work is beginning with them. The missioneries who went before us have built up the christian communities that we today are coming to minister to. Three of us in the parish of fiance cannot minister properly to 17,000 people. A lot of our parishioners are at the out stations and very often during the rainy season especially, it is impossible to get out there on any regular basis, When I get to know the language a bit better I intend to preach not to the multitude but to the few in the areas that 1 will be responsible for. A small group properly instucted in what true christian living is about could minister to the whole community and build it through teaching into a true christian community.

The people here are very friendly. As soon as they heard the new 'fadder' had arrived many of them were around to great me. The children are really pleasant. They just swarm around you ot get shaking hands. There is a very young population in this country. Out of a total population of 8,000,000 I'm told that 60% is under 20. The life expectancy here is a lot lower than at home. This is due to the heat, food and maybe lack of proper medical facilities. There are a lot of old flies around to that carry various diseases. If there is not proper medicine to counteract this then death can be at quite a young age. The native food is not exactly what someone from Inver has been used to all his life. It's good food but I think sometimes it's beter as 'abhar machnaimh in eit greim long ithe'. I was really brave when I came here first. I ate a lot of native food. I bore the consequences. For a few days it was as if I drank a pint of Castor oil. May I add an awkward situation to be in here as the necessary in such situations are not always the most plentiful. I recovered eventually and I stick to a more traditional diet. The cooks now prepare some potatoes, meat and vegetables for one meal each day. Fruit is very plentiful. Oranges, bananas and any kind of fruit you ever saw or heard of is just growing around the gardens here.

#### ENVIRONMENT

Perhaps it would be appropriate at this time of year to take a look at one of our largest native predators, viz the fox (Vulpas Vulpes). The fox has been known from the earliest time for its cunning and shrewdness whether in pursuit of food or eluding capture.

When mycamatosis decimated the rabbit population of Britain the fox turned to its other sources of food, mainly the fit Vole. In Ireland due to the non-existance of the field Vostudies showed that after the arrival of myxamatosis rats became the main alternative diet of the fox. J.S. Fairley Irish Beast Book because of the preponderance of smaller fields and additional cover of hedges and ditches, which premote the Rat population, they have become a more common item in the foxe's diet, even when rabbits are readily available.

This would explain the survival of the fox in years when rabbits became very scarce. The dependence of the rat on fox leads to its own natural elimination through 'Weils Disease' (spirochactal jaundice), a disease associated wit rats.

Apart from the commendable job of eliminating rats, the fo also disposes of a large amount of carrion, dead sheep oto left unburied in the hills. Much distruction is attribute the fox in the lambing season, a good portion of which cou be due to domestic dogs, wild mink ar mismanagment by the farmer of his flock. The 'vanished lamb', which is general attributed to the fox, is very often a dead lamb at birth through starvation and cold.

The practice of poisoning lands for foxes is dangerous to forms of wild life, domestic animals and even humans. As with most wild life species the least interferance by man allows for its own natural controls to function.

### GARBAGE Some tips.

For those of us who do not have the benefit of a Bin Collection Service, dealing with refuse and waste material is very important if we are to play our part in preserving the amenities of our countryside.

The following suggestions may prove helpful:All household scraps should be wrapped in paper or
packed into small cartons. The new litre milk cartons are
ideal for this purpose. These packages should then be burned
in the range or open-fire. Never throw waste food suiside ac
this may encourage rats.

Papers, cartons, plastic containers etc. can be burned in a garden bonfire.

Tins, after they have been opened and emptied, should be washed out and then open the other end, placed the two ends inside the tin and put your foot on the side of the tin which will squash flat quite easily. If these tins, also bottler and other unburnable material are put into a large carton this can then be perodically taken to the Council dump. The dumping of such waste in ditches at the roadside is to be greatly deplored. There are some folk who favour dumping in a river or in the tide but let no one think that because their refuse has departed from their sight that it has gone for ever because inevitably it will turn up somewhere else as witnessed by the tide line on our beaches and the unsightly state of the shore at the junction of the Glen and Tellow Rivers.

Brian Byrne - treasurer.




